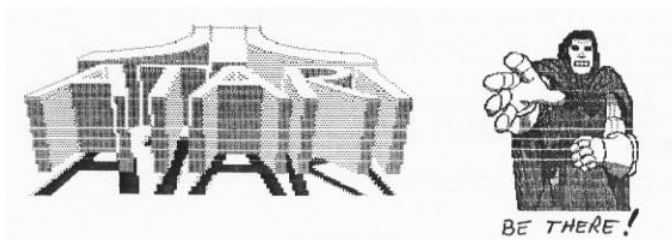
President's Corner by Michael Current

SIDE A:

This side on the January DOM has four demos on it. Let's begin looking at them, shall we?

X-MAS badTRO (by *Lamers*): This is a funny demo for Christmas of 2013. It shows a picture of a snowman on the splash screen and he looks like he is eating a cookie. Then, we see a pretty cool looking demo of an animated Christmas tree with three Santas at the bottom of it being chased by a creature trying to eat them! 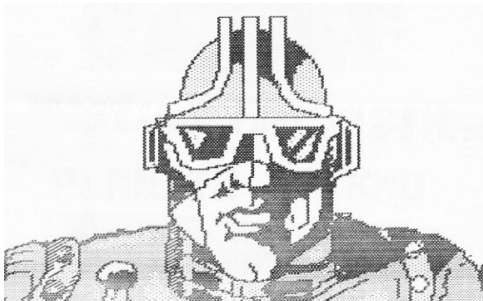
Graphics: Two thumbs up

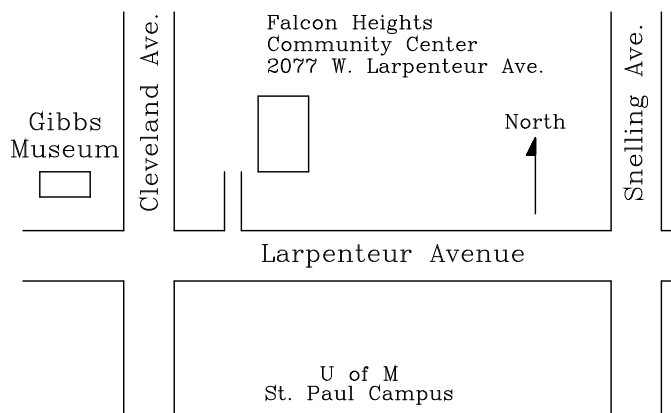
