Thanks, keep using that Atari, and come to your next SPACE meeting and PARTY, Friday December 11, 2015.

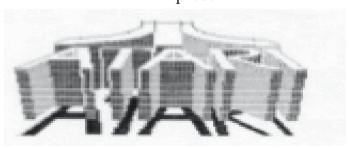


Treasurer's Report By Gregory Leitner

Atari 8-bit DOM Review

Hey there, fellow Atarians! Welcome to the latest 8-bit DOM Review for the Club.

This is going to be a short review since there are only four programs in the entire DOM. So, I will now get going on that.

Side A:

Sprint 1 is a coin-op arcade conversion of the original Atari smash hit racing game. Not only does it look cool for a game of its time, the conversion is spot-on. I enjoyed trying to play it, but I need to get used to the controls. The was a great game in 1978 and it is in 2015!

Graphics: 10 Gameplay: 10 Sound: 10 Animation: 10

Total: 40/40 (perfect arcade conversion)

Near is a great looking demo and it really pushes the aesthetics of what the 8-bit parallax do. It has scrolling, real-time 3D, and excellent graphics. Ι am speechless (yes literally, because I am typing and not speaking - pun intended). Besides the PAL issues, it is a great demo, nonetheless.

Side B:

Skunk 55 is a dice game where you have to get to a certain amount of points before your opponent (computer or human) can beat you to it. I really don't know how to play this game, since it never came with instructions.

But, somehow, I beat the computer, which says something. However, I wish the programmer included instructions to the game. Because, then the game would have been easier to play.

Finally, we have what I think is the best game on the DOM: Gravity. It is very addictive. I could not stop playing for at least an hour. I stopped only to review the rest of the DOM.

The game's premise is simple. You have to match up blocks as perfectly as possible and build up a color-coordinated tower of blocks. If you can do it perfectly at the end of the level, you get bonus points.

However, there is a catch. If you miss the mark on some of the columns and you are off, the line of blocks gets smaller and smaller. Plus, as it moves back and forth horizontally, it will get faster in movement if you miss enough. You have to be quick on the joystick or joypad. This is a great game. Play it and see!

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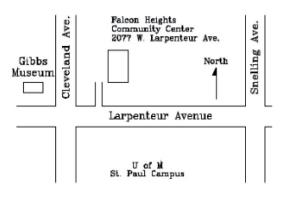
